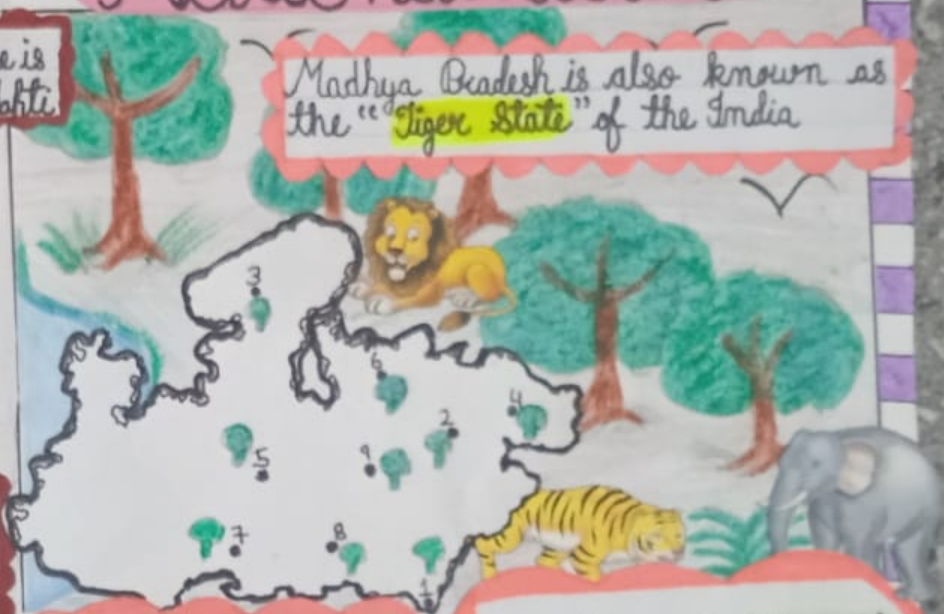

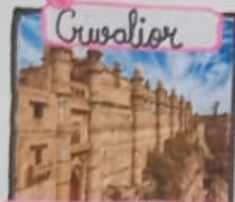

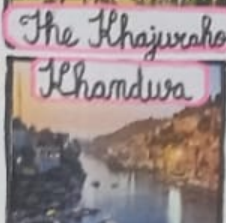

4. Marble rocks of Bhedaiya - Situated at Bhedaiya ghat by the side of river Narmada.

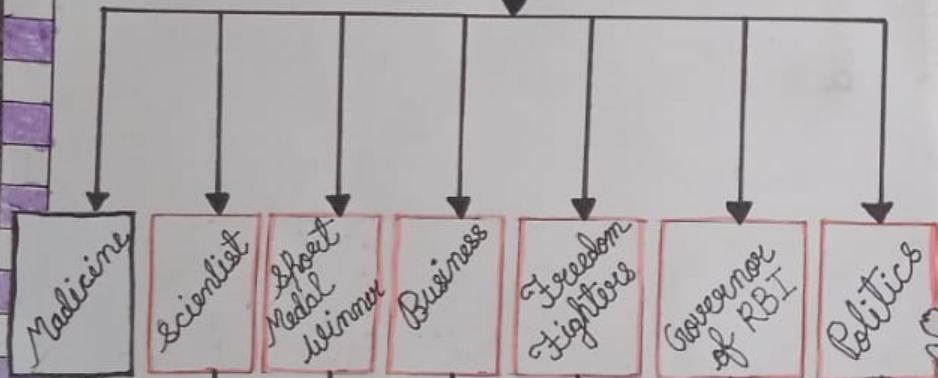
